Hello everyone,

My name is Yvonne Bekkers, 41 years, born and raised in the Netherlands and I work as a professional firefighter in my hometown 's-Hertogenbosch.

When I'm not working I'm busy with my other hobby's. Photography and the Rottweiler. I got involved with the breed when I was in high school studying to be a vet-assistant.

After school in 1996 I became a member of the Dutch Rottweiler Club and not long after that I got my first Rottweiler. (Nouska 1996 -2000) With her I did several obedience

courses and we did lots of shows. The results where overall "Very Good" and "Good", but I have learned so much from this female.

In 1999 I bought Grizzly-Beer (1999 - 2006). He was my buddy, a dog like this you only get once in your life! We did obedience, many shows (and he won several national and international titles) and we started to train IPO. This dogs character was just amazing, I still miss him every day. In 2005 I got Yuran (2005 - 2009), a nice friendly male but he had problems with his joints (elbow and hips) and I was not able to do much showing or training with him.

Then came Kenza, (2002 – 2004), let's just say that she was a troubled little girl from the day we picked her up. We had to put her down because of major behavior problems.

In 2008 I bought Enjoy, (2008 – 2017), we did many shows and trained IPO, we even did the German ZTP. She got injured during the protection work at the club and we had to retire the sport. In July of 2017 after being a beloved pet for several years I had to put her asleep..... Painful and I still miss her every day!

As you can see my Rottweiler did not reach a very old age I think that's why I have a soft spot for dogs in the veteran class, they just melt my heart and I can forgive them a lot......

Next to showing and training with my own dogs, I also showed several dogs from other people. Something I enjoyed very much because it taught me a lot. I'm also a regular visitor (and sometimes competitor)

at the German Klubsieger Zucht shows. In 2001 I did a course to become a ring-worker at dog shows. I was also a member of the board of the Dutch Rottweiler Club for almost 5 years, I had to stop this work because I switched careers and my training to become a firefighter was taking too much time to do the job as a breed-warren correctly. During the years, I also became a test-leader for the Dutch mental test (2004). Because the breed was almost banned in the Netherland due to several biting incidents we were obligated to do this test with our Rottweilers, if not you would not get a pedigree with your pups. I also was a dog trainer for several seasons at our local dog club, where I learned a lot about other breeds as well.

In 1999 I started the course Kynologic Knowledge part 1. I did this because it was given at the local dog club and it was a nice addition to my school education. At a dog show one of my show colleagues told me "you will never become a judge". I had no idea what he was talking about. A few months later it still was going to my head and I went on the internet to find out what it took to become a judge. The challenge for myself was set! I was going to see how far I would get. In 2003 I passed the second course, in 2007 I passed for part 3 and in 2008 I could take my breed exam for the Rottweiler. I passed and from that moment I was a Rottweiler judge.

It's now the beginning of 2018 and looking back I still cannot believe how lucky I was (am). I have been able to judge in: the Netherlands, Sweden, Belgium, Indonesia, Italy, South Africa, Ireland, England, Finland, America, France, IFR World show in Denmark, Spain, Australia, Mexico, Norway, Malaysia and China.

I'm enjoying every moment of my judging and I'm honored that I get the chance to go all over the world to learn about my beloved breed. Yes, it is a learning process, at every show I see new things, learn about other regulations, see different "trends" (some I like, but others I hate.....). Also, meeting new friends with the same passion for the breed is wonderful. And when I'm real lucky I even get the chance to see a little of the country I visit, that's a real bonus.

Open Male/Female: 15 months and older without IPO titles

Champion Male/Female: 15 months and older who have earned a championship from title from RKNA, AKC, CKC, International FCI champions and any champion of record. Copies of Championship must be submitted with entry and originals must be available at the show.

Working Male/Female: 18 months and older with IPO titles. Copys of IPO titles must be subsubmitted with the entry and and originals must be at available at the show.

Veteran Male/Female: 8 years old or older the day of the show. **Brood bitch**- entered by the owner of the brood bitch. Must have at least two (2) offspring appear in the ring. Offspring must be entered in regular classes. The class is evaluated on the merits of the offspring. Owner of the brood bitch does not need to be the owner of the office spring.

Stud dog-Entered by the owner of the stud dog. Must have at least two (2) offspring appear in the ring in the ring. Offspring must be ented in regular classes. Owner of the stud dog does not need to be the owner of the offspring.

Kennel class- Entered by the kennel owner. Three (3)or more dogs dogs bred by the kennel owner and registered with the kennel name of the entrant. All dogs must be entered in the show's regular classes. The kennel owner does not need to be the ower of all the dogs.

Exhibition- Are for critique only. This class is open to all rottweilers with a disqualifying fault, who are altered (ie; spayed or neutered) too young to enter regular puppy class or whose owners do not want to enter their dog in regular classes. No ratings or placements will be awarded. Dogs are critiqued with fault(s) noted. This class is for educational purposes only.

If a dog is eligible for more then one class, the owner may determine the class to enter in.

Please pick up your critiques, Critiques should be available for pick up after each day's events. If you cannot pick your critiques, please provide our show secretary with a stamped, self-addressed envelope to have them mailed to you at no cost. We will provide envelopes at the show site for you to add your address, then we will process and mail for you. Envelope service is \$5.00

STANDARD EVALUATION TEST INFORMATION

The Standard Evaluation Test is the top half of the Breed Suitability test. The dog's conformation must be judged of breeding quality and free of disqualifying faults. The dog must have a weight certificate signed by a vet certifying weight dated 2 weeks prior to test. The dog must have a valid hip certification and have a tattoo for identification or microchip. Handler is responsible for providing the Reader. The Rottweiler is assessed for conformation and soundness. The test includes everything on the dog being measured; including: height at withers. eye color. body length. Bite. dentition. Muzzle. bone strength. chest depth. head shape. chest circumference . cheek bone' skull. general behavior.

Original paperwork must be presented to Show Secretary upon registration at show. This includes registration papers, hip papers, score book and current membership card from organization the score book is held with for titles to be recorded on Standard Evaluation.

RKNA is encouraging all RKNA members, the public and especially breeders to obtain a Standard Evaluation on all breeding stock.

RKNA CHAMPIONSHIP PROGRAM

To attain the RKNA Championship title, a dog must achieve 5 total points. Points can be earned in the following ways:

1 point: V1 rating at any RKNA show from adult class.

1 point Best of Breed from the adult class.

1 point Best of Opposite Sex from the adult class.

2 points: Winning Sieger, Siegerin, Youth Sieger, Youth Siegerin, Best Adult Male/Female, or Best Youth Male/Female. 1 points: Ztp.

2 points: Schutzhund / IPO title.1 point: SE, Standard Evaluation.

AIRPORTS: IAD Dulles International Airport 50miles from show site

BWI Baltimore-Washington international Airport 80 miles from show site

IMPORTANT SHOW INFORMATION

Dogs born in countries with anti-docking laws must be shown with a natural tail. Copies of required documentation for the Champion and Working Classes must be submitted with entry and originals must be brought to the show and be available for inspection before entering the ring. Spayed or neutered dogs may not show with the exceptions of Stud Dog or Brood Bitch Classes. Dogs with missing teeth will be excused from the ring. Males will be judged Dogs are shown in natural stance; no hand stacking is allowed. No food is allowed in the ring; toys may be used at the judge's discretion. Double handling is encouraged. Any entry that does not meet the Class requirement will be invalid. The host club shall not permit entry into any class if an entered dog's original registration and support documents of all certifications, accomplishments and titles are not available at the show for inspection at the time of the class. When a dog is eligible for more than one class, the dog's owner determines the entry. This is a German style Sieger show. The event is being held outdoors, rain or shine. No dogs are allowed to be tied out at the show site or ringside. No dogs are allowed to be crated near the ring. Please use designated areas to exercise your dogs and clean up after them. Adult classes will be moved long enough for the judge to evaluate the movement. You also should be able to show your dog's bite; the front, sides and to open wide. The dog must allow the judge to touch genitals and tail while standing
